I am writing for my mother who is old and unable to write well enough since she has been subject to an emotional shock.

In January 1945 her son Edward D. Slovik #36896415 was executed for deserting the Army at Albuf, France upon authorization of the most Honorable President Eisenhauer (then a General). However she had not been informed about his execution until August 11, 1953 by indirect sources. We regret that her daughter-in-law has not told her about this affair. I can well understand the reason. The knowledge of this would be a disgrace and the strain of shock would have been too great.

Up to this time however, this little lady has not received compensation or insurance for his death. If such is collectable why hasn't the U. S. Army informed her of it?

Acting as her intercessor I wrote to the Personnel Record Center in St. Louis Missouri a little more than two weeks ago for information on Edward's death and insurance. Up to this date I have received no answer? Why? I can't understand it.

Could you be so kind as to help me in this serious matter? Now that the case is de-classified by the Army I think they owe no less than a mere explanation for the unhappiness experienced by Edward's mother.

- l. Careful consideration has been given to your request for the last known address of thirty-one persons named in Comment No. 1. Unfortunately, there is no feasible way such service can be rendered. While the research and clerical time necessary to compile this specific material might not appear excessive, the hundreds of similar requests for lists of various types have presented a problem of considerable magnitude, and the sheer numbers involved have necessitated a policy of denying each of them.
- 2. The Irmy was under no obligation to notify anyone of the death of Private Eddie D. Slovik, 36896415, or the circumstances of death, except the emergency addressee and such other members of his family as he designated. However, a review of the records shows that he only requested that his wife, Mrs. Antoinette W. Slovik, 6320 Termes Avenue, Dearborn, Michigan, be advised.
- 3. There was no obligation, legal or otherwise, requiring the army to notify the next of kin that Slovik was under death sentence between 11 November 1944 and 31 January 1945. However, an individual in his status at that time was free to correspond with anyone during that period.
- 4. The symbols, "GpRD," as used in the phrase, "GFRD #1," fort Meade, Maryland, on 11 July 1944, were abbreviations for "Ground Forces Replacement Depot."
  - 5. The symbols, "GFRS," are abbreviations for "Ground Forces Replacement System."
- 6. The Third Replacement Depot was located at Saint Lo, France, on 19 August 1944, and moved on 21-22 August 1944 to Mortain, France.
- 7. The exact location of Slovik during the period from 15 November 1944 to 29 January 1945 is not disclosed in the Record of Trial, though there is a record therein of his confinement at Regimental Headquarters Prisoner of War Inclosure as of 9 October 1944 and at Divisional Headquarters Prisoner of War Inclosure as of 26 October 1944.
- 8. There are various lists shown in the Record of Trial of persons who were at the stockade, men who served with the 28th Military Police Detachment at the place of confinement and execution. There would be no objection to an examination of the lists by Mr. Huie, but it would be his responsibility to determine who were stockade guards. There is no way in which this office or TJAGO can determine what positions were occupied by those named on the lists.
- 9. As to the actual person who notified Slovik of his death centence, nothing has been found in the Record of Trial of the person whose task this was. It is assumed that immediately after approval of the death sentence on 23 December 1945, Slovik was

informed through channels in the normal manner. There is no way of determining specifically the name of the person who notified Slovik. In fact, in order to make the procedure impersonal, ordinarily the name of such person is not recorded.

Dear Mrs. Serafine:

First of all I wish to again express my regrets because of the delay in answering your inquiries of 3 September and 18 September. This was occasioned by the fact that the files, which are normally kept in my St. Louis office, had been called in here in connection with your several previous inquiries, some of which were sent St. Louis and some of which were sent here. After the file had been returned to St. Louis, your later inquiry was received here, so was sent to St. Louis. The complete file and unanswered letters are now here and I trust that your inquiries can now be fully answered.

Your brother did not die in the regular course of action but was executed 31 January 1945 at St. Marie, France. Having been found guilty of absenting himself without proper leave with intent to avoid action against the energy, he was sentenced by a General Court-Martial to be shot, which sentence had been confirmed by duly designated authority.

Not knowing which records Mr. Huie showed you, it is not possible to answer your question regarding their authenticity. As stated in my letter of 28 August, Mr. Huie has not been granted access to any of your brother's records which are in my custody. He is not connected with my office, and as far as I know, is not connected with any other Government agency but is a professional writer.

In compliance with Department of the Army policy, information concerning the death of any member of the Army is given the Emergency Addressee designated by that member, which in the case of your brother was his wife, Mrs. Antoinette W. Slovik. As explained in previous letters, this was done. This information is also given to other members of the servicemen's immediate family only upon their specific request.

As your brother's file is now being returned to my St. Leuis office, it is suggested that should you have any further questions regarding it, you write there.

(1) Did my brother die in the regular course of action, or not. If not was he executed and why, where and when.

(2) Were the records (or copies) shown us by Mr. Huie authentic?

(3) How did Mr. Huie have these records if they are in custody of the Adjutant General and no permission was granted to him to have access to same.

(4) Does Mr. Huie have any connection with the Adjutant Generals Office, or any other Government Agency, and how do you suppose he gained the papers and information he passed on to us?

Dear Mr. President:

I have just finished reading with amazement the article in this week's Look magazine regarding the case of Pvt. Eddie Slovik who was executed as a deserter.

I was a combat infantryman with the 3hth Infantry Division and know of several instances where men deserted while on the front line. Two of these men were in my own section. It was common know-ledge among our men that desertion would not be punished by death. I certainly do not condone desertion among soldiers but no doubt there were hundreds of similar cases where the death sentence was not imposed. Why one one single soldier was singled out for execution is beyond my comprehension.

I realize that nothing can be done now to rectify the injustice done Pvt. Slovik but certainly steps can be taken to give his widow the back pay and allowances p us the amount of insurance due at the time of his death.

As a veteran who has served honorabley under the command, I beg of you to institute the proper steps so that the widow of Pvt. Slovik may receive the help that she is entitled to receive.



As of our conversation of August 13, 1953 in which you advised me to write a request directly to you for detailed information on the above deceased who is my brother.

As you may recall in our conversation that neither Ed's mother nor I had been informed of his death or the cause of same. Therefore we were shocked to have Mr. William Bradford Huie break the news of Edward's execution. However I can't understand why his records were de-classified and released to someone whom we don't know. We can't understand Mr. Huie's purpose or his interest in possessing these records. His explanation was that he could write a story on this and make it a startling one at that, when one boy among so many deserters was executed. It is history in itself when one considers it hasn't happened in approximately 90 years.

However, you could help me clear matters if you could send me information on the following:

Has permission been granted to Mr. Huie to have these records? Has anyone been notified in the event of Edward's death? Who? Is the insurance still unclaimed? Who's beneficiary? Is it still collectable if unclaimed at the present time? How did Mr. Huie know who was beneficiary?

He told us he saw the insurance papers.

My best to you since it means a great deal for my widowed mother and to me to know these things.
