violence," is one of the founding sponsors of the Fair Play for Cuba Committee and the editor of the Negro newsletter, Crusader. He was part of a Fair Play delegation to Cuba in 1960.

Williams organized a Fair Play delegation to visit Cuba including John Henrik Clarke, Negro historian, Artist Edward Clark, Poet LeRoi Jones, Fair Play Secretaries Pat Linden and Lee Kolk, and Philadelphia Writer Joseph Hunter. While in Havana, Williams demonstrated at the American Embassy in protest sgainst alleged anti-Negro activity in Monroe, N.C., and ridiculed the American demand for elections under Castro.

In September 1960 he wrote a letter to Fidel Castro inviting him to visit him at his home in Monroe, N.C. Fair Play for September 16, 1960, referred to the

invitation as a "time bomb."

Speaking before the Fair Play for Cuba Committee of Columbia University on February 10, 1961, Robert F. Williams remarked, "I don't know what kind of 'ism' they have in Cuba today, but whatever it is, we could use a little of it in the United States." This was evidently part of an EPCC tour covering Indiana University, Antioch College, Los Angeles, San Diego, San Francisco, Seattle, Portland, Vancouver, and Denver." In his newsletter, the Crusader, Williams has carried to his Negro leaders, a glowing description of Castro's agrarian reform program."

In June of 1960 a literary supplement to the Havana newspaper Revolucion was published on the American Negro. It carried an original poem by Langston Hughes, who has in the past supported Communist candidates for public

The hands of the Fair Play for Cuba Committee were clearly visible in a pro-Castro-Lumumba demonstration held in United Nations Plaza, New York City, on February 18, 1961. Placards displayed read as follows: "Cuba Si, Congo Oui, Yankee No." "Hands Off Cuba." Chanted slogans were: "Viva Lumumba!" "Viva Fidel Castro!" "Down With Yankee Imperialism!" "I

The Havana Radio Centro broadcast on June 6, 1961, condemned the U.S. Supreme Court decision and the "virtual outlawing of the Communist Party and, in practice the outlawing of all those \* \* \* who declare themselves in favor of \* \* \* the rights of the Negroes."

William W. Worthy, Jr., a Negro, is a featured writer in the bulletins of the Fair Play for Cuba Committee. During his career he has displayed a marked hostility to the United States and its laws. On April 25, 1944, he was indicted before a Federal grand jury in Philadelphia for violation of the Selective Service and Training Act of 1940. He failed to report for a physical examination in Boston on March 10, 1942, as a conscientious objector. He failed to report to a conscientious objectors' camp at Kane, Pa., on December 8, 1943, as ordered and a conscientious objectors' camp at Kane, Pa., on December 8, 1943, as ordered and on June 12, 1944, upon a plea of guilty, was sentenced to 1 day in prison by the Federal court in Philadelphia.

In the 1950's, Worthy went to Communist China without an American passport and in violation of passport regulations prohibiting such travel, as a result of which he lost his passport. In December 1954 his passport was restored to

full validity and he made a trip for CBS to the Soviet Union. He is a correspondent for the Afro-American newspapers of Baltimore.

In the January 10, 1961, issue of the Afro-American, Worthy wrote from Havana about an alleged bombing attack for which he holds the United States

responsible. He said:
"After the Cuban newspapers published photographs of the bombing materials seized by the police—pictures of dynamite containers clearly marked 'Made in U.S.A.'—50 ashamed American visitors went to a Havana hospital and donated blood for the innocent Cuban victims of the bombings.

"The Americans were among the 800 who visited the island under the auspices of the Fair Play for Cuba Committee."

#### COMMUNIST THREAT TO U.S. THROUGH THE CARIBBEAN

In the Afro-American of April 29, 1961, there appeared a large advertisement called "A Declaration of Conscience by Afro-Americans" and sponsored by the Fair Play for Cuba Committee. In testimony of Dr. Charles A. Santos-Buch on January 10, 1961, it was shown that a previous advertisement of this committee appearing in New York Times of April 6, 1960, was paid for in major part by an official of the Cuban Government. In the April 29, 1961, advertisement, William Worthy is quoted as saying:
"If Cuba is attacked, I and others who know the facts will denounce the at-

tack as an evil and wicked colonial war deserving of opposition and resistance

by Afro-Americans." Despite voluminous evidence and reports to the contrary, Worthy claims that neither Fidel Castro nor his revolutionary movement are Communist and that he himself is anti-Communist. Ignoring the testimony of knowledgeable Cubans, Worthy claims that Cuba today is free, allowing habeas corpus, the freedom to speak, to publish, to worship, to travel at home or abroad. He declared: "It is obscenely hypocritical for North Americans to preach sermons to Cuba about the 'urgency of free elections.'" He charges that "Politically wild and irresponsible elements in the Pentagon, dehumanized cold-war fanatics in the Claim and the Claim of the proposition of the content of the cold-war fanatics in the Claim of the claim 

The 17th Convention of the Communist Party, U.S.A., held in December 1959, adopted a resolution with reference to Cuba, which clearly delineates how the party proposes to capitalize the present situation. It said:

"The people of the United States can learn much from Cuba's democracy. The new government, in enunciating its set of principles a year ago, placed the

elimination of racism as one of its major immediate objectives."

James E. Jackson, Jr., a Negro, is listed in Communist sources as the Communist Party's secretary for southern and Negro affairs and as secretary of

munist rarty s secretary for southern and Negro affairs—and as secretary of the National Committee of the Communist Party, U.S.A.

He was the first American Communist leader to publicly address a meeting of the 21st Congress of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union, according to the Worker of April 19, 1959, page 16. Part of his remarks were made in Russian. Mr. Jackson was convicted under the Smith Act on July 31, 1956, sentenced to 2 years' imprisonment, and his case was disminated by the constant.

According to the Daily Worker of December 2, 1954, Jackson believes that "the South is that region of the United States where the most powerful revolutionary pressures may develop." What Mr. Jackson did after his return from Moscow is therefore significant.

On August 19, 1960, Jackson, who was listed as a member of the party's ruling secretariat, addressed the Eighth National Assembly of the Popular Socialist Party (Communist Party) of Cuba held in Havana, heading the American party's delegation. He paid ardent tribute to Fidel Castro as "that outstanding national hero and stateman" and spoke with pride of the "militant mass actions of the Negro people—featuring mass sit-in actions, marches, and demontions of the Negro people—featuring mass sit-in actions, marches, and demonstrations" in the United States.

This is the same James E. Jackson, Jr., who in the past has been one of the stanchest advocates of an independent Negro republic in the South, which would, if carried forward, have embrolled the Negroes of the South in a bloody and costly civil war. Thus far it is evident Fidel Castro and his Communist henchmen have been unsuccessful in entangling American Negroes in their nefarious designs



Mr. Joe Louis, who you advised is the former heavyweight boxing champion of the world, and who resides in Cassar's Palace, Las Vegas, Nevada, was the subject of a Registration Act investigation conducted by the FBI during February and March, 1960, under his true name of Joseph Louis Barrow. That investigation was based on information indicating that Mr. Louis had been hired to act as an agent for the Castro Government in the United States. This investigation was discontinued when Mr. Louis' firm, Louis-Howe-Fisher-Lockhart Enterprises, Incorporated, terminated its contract with the Cuban Government and registered with the Department of Justice. (100-385510-43)

The central files of the FBI further reveal that in November, 1951, it was reported that Mr. Louis had associated with Paul Robeson, and that he had, with personal appearances or through the use of his name, sided the following communist organizations: Council of African Affairs, Southern Conference for Human Welfare. American Youth for Democracy, and the United Negro and Allied Veterans of America. All of the above organizations have been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450, with the exception of the Southern Conference for Human Welfare, an organization cited by the House Committee on Internal Security (HCIS). Paul Robeson is the Negro singer who, according to the HCIS, was illentified as a communist in sworn testimony before that Committee, and was also declared to have had an extensive record of communist front activity. The January 5, 1960, issue of the "Evening Star," Washington, D.C., carried an article in which it was reported that Joe Louis, former fighter, praised the Cuban Government for a new tourist promotion campaign aimed at particular groups, such as Negroes, Jews and young people. (62-40510)

JOE LOUIS, ex-heavyweight boxing champion, voluntarily appeared in the Detroit Office, Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). The credentials of the interviewing Agents were shown to LOUIS. LOUIS stated that he is temporarily residing at the St. Regis Hotel, Detroit, Michigan.

LOUIS claimed that his food is being doped, and germs in the form of liquid are being sprayed in his hotel room as a result of the Mafia.

LOUIS stated that the Mafia could not afford to "kill him outright" in view of LOUIS' popularity; however, they are trying to dispose of him through the aforementioned tactics.

LOUIS was unable to furnish any detailed information relative to the call except that he was sure that it was in New York. LOUIS stated that he was sure that the call was made to New York because he could "tell by the dial tones while listening on the extension".

LOUIS was unable to furnish any description relative to the same as mentioned above, except that he was a Negro male and worked for the Mafia.

Hoyt Co., Inc., agent for the Surinam Tourist Development Board; Sheldon Z. Kaplan, agent for the Ministry of Communications and Public Works, Government of Guatemala; Julius Klein Public Relations, Inc., agent for A Committee Representing German Industrialists and Civic Leaders in Germany and Julius Klein Public Relations, Inc. in Frankfurt, Germany; Maurice Feldman, agent for the Republic of Brazil; and E M B (Ltd.), agent for the Reserve Bank of India, State Bank of Pakistan and Banco Central de Reserva del Peru.

Among the registrations of interest during this period are several political groups two of which seek to propagandize the current political

and economic conditions in Cuba. One of these registrants is an organization by the name of Movimento del Pueblo Libre. The purpose of this organization as stated in its registration statement is to combat Communism in the Americas and to restore a truly democratic Government to the Republic of Cuba. It claims to have a membership within the United States of 5,000 persons and a membership outside of the United States of 600,000 persons. The organization is headed by Dr. Carlos Marquez Sterling. Another such group interested in the ultimate overthrow of the Castro regime is an organization known as "La Rosa Blanca" (The White Rose). According to this organization's registration statement it seeks to "expose through legal propaganda to the public opinion of the continent the Communist nature of the Cuban dictatorship and its inhuman brutalities against the Cuban people". Membership in the United States is listed as approximately 200 and membership outside the United States as "several thousands." The foreign principal is listed as an underground movement in Cuba also known as "La Rosa Blanca".

Another political organization, the Nicaraguan Liberation Movement of July 23rd, registered for the purpose of engaging in propaganda activities to acquaint "the American public with the political, economic and social condition in Nicaragua under the Nicaraguan Dictatorial Regime."

Donald Gavarrete is President of this group.

Also in the Latin American field are several individual registrations of interest as for example John Ek. Mr. Ek filed a statement as an agent of five Cuban officials for the stated purpose of conducting investigations of the activities of Cubans in the United States. A Washington attorney, Joseph A. Fanelli, filed a registration statement as counsel for the Republic of Cuba for the purpose of prosecuting in the United States courts

a claim against Miguel Pons, a former Cuban Naval Attache in Washington, D.C. Joseph Louis Barrow, better known as Joe Louis, former heavyweight boxing champion, filed a short-form registration statement in support of the registration of Louis-Rowe-Fisher-Lockart Enterprises, Inc. This organization has been retained by the National Tourist Commission of Cuba for publicity, public relations and advertising. Ruben Oscar Miro Guadia registered as an agent of Carlos Suere Calvo of the Republic of Panama and advised in his statement that he intended to solicit funds to support the presidential campaign of Victor Florencia Goytia in the Republic of Panama.

Two other registrants Raul F. Kulberg and Stephen Bernard Gleason, are registered as agents of Soviet Embassy personnel and are registered respectively for furnishing information to and receiving an assignment from the Embassy personnel.





Joseph Louis Barrow, who is also known as Joe Louis, former heavyweight boxing champion of the world, was the subject of a Registration Act investigation conducted by the FBI during February and March, 1960. This investigation was based on information indicating that Mr. Louis had been hired to act as an agent for the Castro Government in the United States. This investi-

All of the above organizations have been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450, with the exception of the Southern Conference for Human Welfare, an organization cited by the House Committee on Un-American Activities (HCUA). 
