I, Sp/4 James W Mattox on the 26th of April was in charge of a detail to wash
the ceiling in the squad bay. There was six of us so we were working in pairs.
Hendrix and Stroble, Klien and McDermott and Christer and myself. Every once in
awhile I would catch Hendrix setting down on his foot locker or laying down on
his bunk trying to get some sleep. Around 1000 hrs I looked all over the squad
bay for Hendrix but couldn't find him. I asked Stroble if he knew where Hendrix
had gone and he said he didn't know where he had gone but he had been gone for a-
bout 20 minutes. I then went into the latrine and saw Hendrix sitting in the last
comode. I thought he was sitting there sleeping so I stood on the stool in the
comode next to his and looked into his comode, there sat Hendrix masturbating
himself. At that time Stroble came into the latrine and I motioned him to come
over and witness what was happening. He took a look and then went back into the
squad bay and started working again. *JWM*

No person subject to this code shall compel any person to incriminate himself or to answer any question the answer to which may tend to incriminate him. No person subject to this code shall interrogate, or request any statement from, an accused or a person suspected of an offense without first informing him of the nature of the accusation and advising him that he does not have to make any statement regarding the offense of which he is accused or suspected and that any statement made by him may be used as evidence against him in a trial by court-martial. 

I, James C. Spears, Plt Sgt of the Service, Supply, & Evacuation Platoon have known Pvt Hendrix for approximately 6 months. He has been in my platoon for approximately 3 months. This individual has shown very little interest in the Army, his personal equipment, and his area in the billets. He has also proven unsatisfactory on his job. Numerous attempts at counseling by his platoon leader, section leader, section chief and myself on his ability to become a better soldier have met with negative results. Pvt Hendrix has worked in the supply section as a warehouseman, for which he was school trained, and has done a very unsatisfactory job from the beginning. Pvt Hendrix fails to pay just debts. He owes a laundry bill of approximately \$80.00 and has made no effort whatsoever to pay it. When Pvt Hendrix was questioned by the 1st Sgt and myself concerning this matter, he said he had given the money to a bud dy in an infantry unit to pay this debt for him. It was later proven he had lied about this. To this date the laundry bill is still delinquent. This individual requires additional instructions and sometimes requires a supervisor to stay right on the job with him in order to get it done. Approximately 1 month ago, five other men in the billets were on detail in the billets with Pvt Hendrix. When he was found to be missing, Sp/4 Mattox and Pvt Stroble began to look for him and later found him in the latrine masturbating.

Pvt Hendrix plays a musical instrument in a band off duty and has let this interfere with his military duties in so much as missing bed check and not getting enough sleep. He has no interest whatsoever in the Army.

With the counseling and supervision he has had, it is my opinion that Pvt Hendrix will never come up to the standards required of a soldier. I feel that the military service will benefit if he is discharged UP AR 635-208 as soon as possible. *JCS*



Misses bed check, sleeps while supposed to be working, unsatisfactory duty performance, requires excessive supervision at all times and was caught masturbating by two other members of his platoon. EM has been counseled by the undersigned at extreme lengths, by the 1st Sgt, Platoon Leader and Section Sergeant. Appears to be an extreme introvert. This man has the same type problems under two squad leaders. Performance of duty in the barracks and as a supply clerk is unsatisfactory under both supervisors.

2. Recommend that subject EM be eliminated from the service prior to his normal ETS under the provisions of AR 635-208 and issued an Undesirable Discharge Certificate, DD Form 258A. EM has waived hearing by a board of officers.

I have known Pvt James M Hendrix, RA 19 693 532, since he was assigned to the
Unit in Nov 61. He was assigned to the Repair Parts Section for duty as a supply
clerk. Shortly after his assignment his section Sgt, Sgt Bowman, came to me and
indicated that Hendrix was going to be a problem. I have since then found that
Hendrix is poorly motivated for the military, has no regard for regulations, re-
quires excessive supervision while performing his duties, pays no heed to counsel-
ing from his supervisors as to his shortcomings. He is a habitual offender when it
comes to making bed check, having missed bed check in March, April and May.

Hendrix has been counseled regarding his shortcomings at extreme lengths by
Capt Gilbert R Batchman, to no avail. At times Hendrix isn't able to carry on an
intelligent conversation, paying little attention to having been spoken to. At
one point it was thought perhaps Hendrix was taking dope and was sent to be ex-
amined by a medical officer with negative results. He has been undergoing group
therapy at Mental Hygeine with negative results.

Pvt Hendrix plays a musical instrument during his off duty hours, or so he
says. This is one of his faults, because his mind apparently cannot function
while performing duties and thinking about his guitar.

On 23 May 62, Hendrix missed bed check, also at that time his pass privileges
were withdrawn by the company commander. However Hendrix will readily admit to be-
ing off post without a pass, showing no regard for regulations.

I recommend with out hesitancy that Hendrix be eliminated from the service
under the provisions of AR 635-208 as expeditious as possible. *BA*

I, Lyndon D. Williams, 2d Lt, Section Leader of the Supply and Evacuation Section of this unit, make the following statement concerning Pvt James Hendrix:

Since his assignment to my section, Pvt Hendrix has shown a lack of interest and drive, and apparent inability to concentrate on an assigned task. Even the most simple instructions often must be repeated several times before the task is carried out. Constant supervision is necessary to obtain even barely satisfactory results from Pvt Hendrix.

In counseling Pvt Hendrix, his explanation is that he "has trouble keeping his mind on his work". In addition, Pvt Hendrix has had disciplinary measures taken repeatedly for failure to repair and for other minor offenses.

Because Pvt Hendrix has shown little improvement despite concentrated effort on the part of the platoon and company officers and NCO's, because the constant supervision that must be given him deprives other personnel and activities of needed attention, and because of the detrimental effect of his behavior on the morale and efficiency of the men of the section, I believe that Pvt Hendrix should be eliminated from the service.
