
I am pleased to recommend to you Mr. Richard Milhous Nixon who attended the Duke University School of Law for three full academic years from 1934 to 1937.


Dear Sir:

Dear Sir:

I have been asked by Mr. Richard M. Nixon, an applicant for a commission in the United States Navy, to write to you concerning my opinion of his fitness for such an appointment.

I have known Mr. Nixon since January 22, 1942. Since then we have worked daily side by side at the Office of Price Administration in Washington. In the intervening three months I have seen him, starting from an assignment to relatively unimportant tasks, accomplish a practical reorganization of the Tire Rationing Section, to which he was originally assigned, conceive and organize a department for the coordination of the rulings in connection with all the Rationing Programs, and receive an advancement in classification and salary. In the course of these unusual achievements he has given unmistakable indication of the possession in the highest degree of initiative, resourcefulness, tact, ability to cooperate with and to direct the work of other men, leadership and an almost unique capacity to enlist the loyal support of his co-workers.



Richard M. Nixon has requested that I write you in connection with his application for a Naval officer's commission.

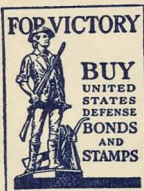

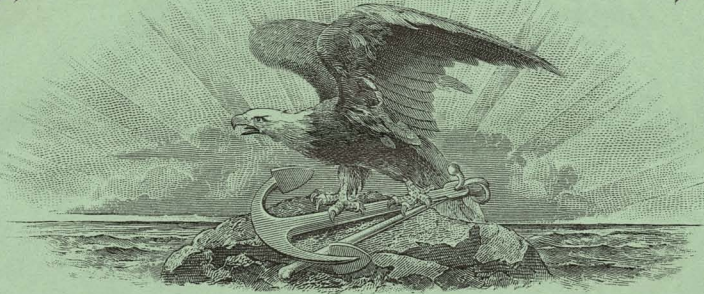
