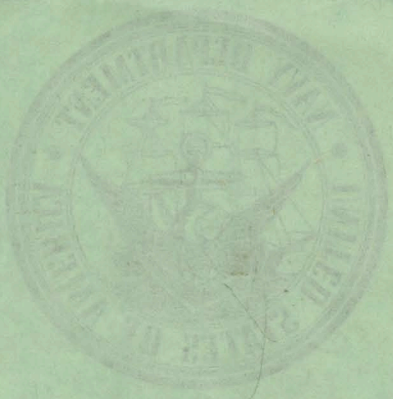

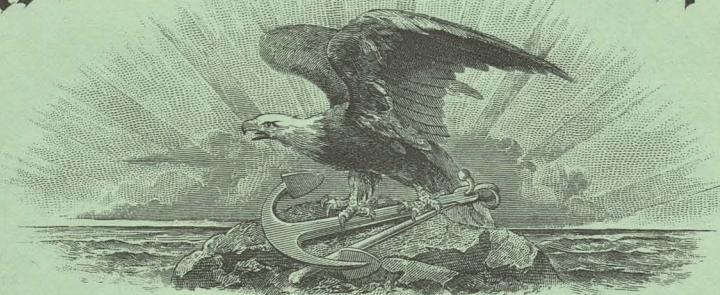

3. 


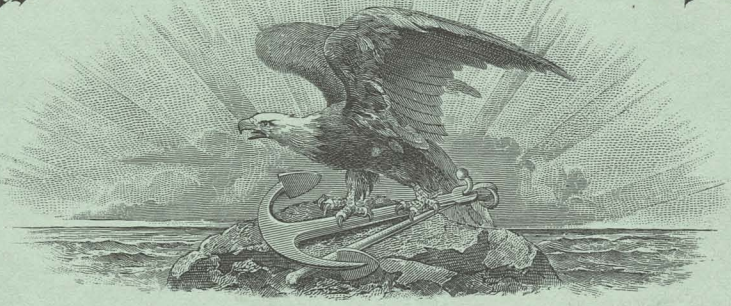
