1. Recent screening of Naval Reserve officers indicates that you have been unable to participate actively in the Naval Reserve training program. You are therefore transferred to the Standby Reserve-Inactive (Inactive Status List) effective 30 June 1966.
2. As you know, non-participating members of the Standby Reserve-Inactive (USNR-S2) are ineligible for consideration for promotion, but under certain circumstances may be subject to recall to active duty in time of war or a national emergency declared by the President and the Congress. It is also necessary that their records be kept current with regard to their mobilization potential.
3. Unless you anticipate that your personal situation will change in the near future to such an extent that you will desire to resume active participation in the Naval Reserve, it is suggested that you consider transferring to the Retired Reserve. Retirement in your case would be honorary in nature and would not entitle you to retired pay or allowances. You would, however, retain your rank and title as a commissioned officer in the Naval Reserve. Since you cannot be transferred to the Retired Reserve unless you specifically request it, appropriate retirement request forms and a reply envelope are enclosed.
4. If you do not desire to retain your Naval Reserve commission, you may, of course, resign. Acceptance of your resignation by the Secretary of the Navy would result in your honorable discharge from the naval service.
5. Your past loyal service in the United States Naval Reserve is sincerely appreciated and if you conclude that it is inappropriate for you to resume active participation, it is hoped that you will retain your commission in a retired status.

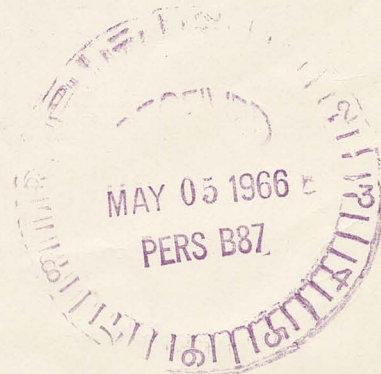

Richard Milhous Nixon, the son of Francis Anthony Nixon and Mrs. (Hannah Milhous) Nixon, was born on January 9, 1913, in Yorba Linda, California. He was graduated from Whittier College, Whittier, California, with the degree of Bachelor of Arts, in 1934, and in 1937 received the degree of Bachelor of Laws from Duke University at Durham, North Carolina. Between 1937 and 1942 he practiced law in Whittier, and from January to August 1942 was an attorney for the Office of Emergency Management in Washington, D. C.

On June 15, 1942 he accepted an appointment as a Lieutenant (junior grade) in the U. S. Naval Reserve, and was promoted to Lieutenant, October 1, 1943, and later to Lieutenant Commander, October 3, 1945.

Following his appointment in the Naval Reserve in 1942 he had aviation indoctrination training at the Naval Training School, Naval Air Station, Quonset Point, Rhode Island. Upon completing the course there in October 1942 he had duty until May 1943 at the Naval Reserve Aviation Base, Ottumwa, Iowa, as Aide to the Executive Officer. He then reported to Commander Air Force, U. S. Pacific Fleet, and was assigned as Officer in Charge of the South Pacific Combat Air Transport Command at Guadalcanal and later at Green Island.

For this service he received a Letter of Commendation from the Commander South Pacific Area and South Pacific Force for "meritorious and efficient performance of duty as Officer in Charge of the South Pacific Combat Air Transport Command..." The citation continues: "He displayed sound judgment and initiative in organizing the South Pacific Combat Air Transport Command at both Bougainville and Green Islands. He established the efficient liaison which made possible the immediate supply by air of vital material and key personnel, and the prompt evacuation of battle casualties from these stations to rear areas."

Between August and December 1944 he was assigned to Fleet Air Wing EIGHT, and thereafter until March 1945 was attached to the Bureau of Aeronautics, Navy Department, Washington, D. C. While serving in the Office of the Bureau of Aeronautics General Representative Eastern District, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, he was relieved of active duty, March 10, 1946.

Lieutenant Commander Nixon has the American Campaign Medal; the Asiatic-Pacific Campaign Medal; and the World War II Victory Medal.

During the period Aug '44 - Dec '44 LT RICHARD NIXON, USNR lived at 2829 Divisadero, San Francisco, Calif. LT NIXON was at that time attached to the Headquarters Squadron, Fleet Air Wing Eight at Naval Air Station, Alameda, Calif. The mission of this Headquarters Squadron was to maintain, service, outfit and commission new aircraft squadrons. His primary duty was Building & Grounds Officer, and Transportation Officer for the Headquarters Squadron. In this capacity he had supervision over the allocation, housekeeping and general state of repair of 3 aircraft hangers and adjacent aircraft parking areas.

His commanding officer, CDR Peter F. Boyle (now CAPT, USN, retired) commented on LT NIXON's performance that he performed his duties in an excellent manner, displaying a high degree of initiative and good judgment in his work. He further stated that LT NIXON was exceptionally willing and cooperative and could be relied upon to complete assigned tasks. It was also noted that LT NIXON had a pleasing personality and was very neat in dress and appearance.

LT NIXON left this assignment to attend the Army Industrial College in Wash., D.C.
