


Dear General Ulio:

His popularity as a citizen and soldier will not only make our bond and stamp campaign a success, but it will increase the flame of patriotism and Americanism in the hearts of the thousands of his race.

Our committee was informed by Corp. Joe Louis Barrow that he would be happy to attend our celebration stating also that he had refused other invitations.
