CAPTAIN EDWARD JOHN STEICHEN, U.S. NAVAL RESERVE (RETIRED)

Captain Steichen, born in Luxembourg, March 27, 1879, came to the United States in 1882. He attended Pio Nono College, Milwaukee, Wisconsin. In 1942 he was given an honorary Master of Arts degree by Wesleyan University, Middletcwn, Connecticut.

In civilian life, Captain Steichen is a noted photographer and artist, and has exhibited photographs and paintings at the great art centres of America and Europe. From 1923 until 1928, Captain Steichen was chief photographer of Conde Nast Publications. He made the aviation photographic mural decoration in the New Roxy Theatre, Radio City, New York.

During World War I, Captain Steicher served with the U.S. Army, in the rank of Lieutenant Colonel. He was Commander, Photographic Division, Air Service with the Army Expeditionary Forces. For his services during World War I, he was awarded the Chevalier of the Legion d'Honneur from the Government of France.

Captain Steichen entered the U.S. Naval Reserve in February 1942, and served during World War II consecutively in the Bureau of Aeronautics, Navy Department, Washington, D.C., and as Commanding Officer of the Naval Aviation Photographic Unit in the Office of the Deputy Chief of Naval Operations (Air), Navy Department. In charge of all Navy combat photographers, he directed the photography of "The Fighting Lady" and the photographic exhibition "Power in the Pacific" for the Museum of Modern Art in New York.

For his services during World War II, Captain Steichen was awarded the Distinguished Service Medal with the following citation:

DISTINGUISHED SERVICE MEDAL:

"For exceptionally meritorious service to the Government of the United States as Commanding Officer of the Naval Aviation Photographic Unit under DCNO (Air) and later as Director of the Navy Photographic Institute during the period February 26, 1942, to the cessation of hostilities with the Japanese Empire. Adapting his wide experience as an illustrious photographer to this important assignment, Captain Steichen maintained the highest possible standards of excellence in Navy photography for training the Navy's flyers, for informing the public as to the progress of the war and for creating an invaluable historical record of our ships, planes and fighting men. In two tours of duty in the Pacific, one in 1943, aboard the USS LEXINGTON when

she sustained a torpedo attack, and again in 1944, at Guam and Iwo Jima, Captain Steichen studied Naval photography at close range. His enthusiasm and skill were responsible for raising to a remarkable plane of realistic art such documentary films as 'The Fighting Lady' as well as moving pictures depicting the drama and fury of aerial combat. In bringing to all Navy photography his own high caliber of achievement, he has rendered distinguished service not only to his contemporaries but also to future generations."

Captain Steichen was ordered relieved of all active duty on October 22, 1945.

In addition to the Distinguished Service Medal, Captain Steichen has the Victory Medal, World War I (U.S. Army), and is entitled to the American Area Campaign Medal and the World War II Victory Medal.

His usual residence is Ridgefield, Connecticut.
