I. AWARDS OF THE SILVER STAR

Under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, August 8, 1932, the Silver Star is awarded by the Commander-in-Chief, Southwest Pacific Area, to the following-named officers serving with the United States Army Forces in the Southwest Pacific Area;

LYNDON B. JOHNSON, Lieutenant Commander, United States
Naval Reserve. For gallantry in action in the vicinity of
Port Moresby and Salamaua, New Guinea, on June 9, 1942. While
on a mission of obtaining information in the Southwest Pacific
Area, Lieutenant Commander Johnson, in order to obtain personal
knowledge of combat conditions, volunteered as an observer on
a hazardous aerial combat missions over hostile positions in
New Guinea. As our planes neared the target area, they were intercepted by eight hostile fighters. When, at this time the
plane in which Lieutenant Commander Johnson was an observer
developed mechanical trouble and was forced to turn back alone,
presenting a favorable target to the enemy fighter, he evidenced
marked coolness in spite of the hazard involved. His gallant
action enabled him to obtain and return with valuable information.
