Thomas Bromley, 2nd Baron Montfort

Thomas Bromley, 2nd Baron Montfort (January 1733 – 24 October 1799), was a British politician.

Bromley was the only son of [Henry Bromley, 1st Baron Montfort](#), and Frances Wyndham, daughter of Thomas Wyndham and sister and heiress of Sir Francis Wyndham, 4th Baronet, of Trent. He was returned to parliament as one of two representatives for [Cambridge](#) in 1754, a seat he held until the following year,^[1] when he entered the [House of Lords](#) on succeeding his father in the barony.

Lord Montfort married Mary Anne Blake, sister of [Sir Patrick Blake, 1st Baronet](#), of Langham, at [Marylebone](#) in 1772. He died in October 1799, aged 66, and was succeeded in the barony by his only son, Henry.
