Personal History: This 21 year old A.S. USNR was born in Lowell, Mass on 3/12/22. He is single, Catholic and enlisted in N.Y. City on Dec. 1942, cannot recall the date. Reported for active duty on March 22, 1943 at the N.T.S., Newport. Admitted to the sick list March 30, 1943 having had 8 days active duty before entering sick list.

Developmental: Denies enuresis.

Educational: Two years of college.

Occupational: Not employed.

Military: Very poor adjustment. "I just can't stand it; I like to be by myself".

He was in the Merchant Marine and was fired because he was bucking everybody.

Sexual: He had a sex contact at age of 14 with a 32 year old woman which upset him somewhat.

Religious: Less religious.

ADMISSION NOTE:

The patient was readmitted 4-2-43
to the sick list at the U.S. Naval
Training Station, Newport, R.I., because
at recruit re-examination he exhibited
vague, disconnected thoughts; he rambled
in a grandiose, philosophical manner;
displayed auditory and visual halluc-
inations. He had been placed on Trial
Duty Status on 3-22-43 due to his ab-
normal conduct. Before this trial period
expired, he was referred to the N.P.
unit for observation. He was trans-
ferred to the Naval Hospital, Newport,
R.I., on 4-2-43 with DU (Dementia Praecox).

At that hospital he was observed
for 5 weeks, and on 5-11-43 the diagnosis
Dementia Praecox, was established. Upon
the approved recommendation of a Board
of Medical Survey, he was transferred
to this hospital, arriving on 5-20-43.
Upon arrival here he was quiet and coop-
erative and courteous to the ward
personnel.

PAST HISTORY:

The patient is the older of two
children (a sister). He was the pet
of both his parents, especially his
mother.

school and a good all-around athlete.
He was outstanding in high school

in August 1940 to June 1941. He quit college then due to fellow students' critical attitude toward him and went to Washington D.C. for three months. His relations are heterosexual. He has no shame, remorse or reluctance to discuss his affairs.

Religious: Although brought up Catholic; he states that he is agnostic, and has been such since 14 years of age.

Occupational: Very unreliable. He has been fired from every job he had except newspaper reporting. The latter was for a small paper at \$15 per week, which he quit. He has been discharged from steamship job, garage job and waiter job. He is irresponsible not caring.

SOURCE OF HISTORY:

The following was obtained from the patient who is freely accessible and cooperative and his statements are considered reliable.

PRESENT ILLNESS:

Patient arrived at the USNHS, Newport, R.I. on 3-22-43. Shortly afterwards began to suffer with headaches and went frequently to sick bay and was given aspirin which he feels

only made the headaches more severe. Prior to enlistment he had suffered with occasional headaches and always obtained relief by taking "aspirin." He found it difficult to adjust to the recruit training program "because of the regimentation and discipline." He was finally re-examined by the psychiatrist

at the end of his period of trial duty and admitted to the dispensary. He denies he was ill at the time or that his headaches were very severe and feels that the physician made a mistake in labeling him as a case of Dementia Praecox. He is no longer bothered with headaches now.

FAMILY HISTORY:

Father, French-Canadian birth, living and well, works as a printer, and has always been a pal of the patient's--"more like a big brother." He has worked as a printer most of his life. During the depression years, was on WPA for a time. In 1941, lost his job because his employers wanted him to send his boy to Boston College whereas the boy had already registered at Columbia University. Since then has obtained other satisfactory employment but according to the patient the father feels that the whole town is "against" the family.

Mother, 48, living and well, closely attached to patient. Also French-Canadian by birth.

Sister, 24, divorced just recently joined the WAAC's. At 18 she married a man of 30 but divorced him after one year. Because of this she was considered the "black sheep" of the family. Patient remarks that in years past he was the favored child but that recently his role has been reversed so that he now looked upon as the "black sheep." No history of mental or nervous diseases.

This patient is an AS (V-6)USNR 21 years old, born in Lowell, Mass., 3-12-22, single, a Catholic, who enlisted in class V-1 of USNR on 8-42

at New York City and reported for active duty at USNTS, Newport, R.I. on 3-22-43 having 10 days active duty on admission to the sick list and 1 month, 28 days active duty on admission to this hospital.

DEVELOPMENTAL:

No significant data elicited. Denies enuresis, somnambulism, temper tantrums, nailbiting, etc.

EDUCATIONAL:

During first 5 grades attended French parochial school and finished up in public high school with high scholastic rating. Completed Lowell High School with good records and given scholarship to Horace Mann Prep in New York where he attended for one year, then given scholarship worth \$500 per year to Columbia University. Completed freshman year (1941) with failure only in chemistry. Did not return the following year but a year later came back at behest of football coach but left after 3 months (Dec. 1942) because funds ran out.

OCCUPATIONAL:

Merchant Marine, 3 months Northern Greenland. Were attacked several times by submarines. Worked in 1942, after leaving Columbia, 3 months as a sports reporter. While at Columbia had NYA job, Private Secretary. Note also patient's occupation as a writer.

Patient was placed on trial duty status when observation at recruit examination showed to be abnormal.

PRE-ILLNESS PERSONALITY:

SEXUAL AND MARITAL:

Has masturbated up until one year ago. Enjoys rather promiscuous relationships with girl friends and is boastful of this. No apparent conflicts over sexual activity noted.

had a personality change when he left Columbia.

PHYSICAL EXAMINATION:

Essentially negative.

NEUROLOGICAL EXAMINATION:

Essentially negative.

MENTAL EXAMINATION:

Patient has been cooperative ever since his admission to this hospital. He is well dressed, neat, tidy and appears to be excellent physical condition. Although alert and attentive most of the time, occasionally he appears somewhat manneristic and pre-occupied.

He gives all information readily and does not appear to be evasive, although a moderate amount of circumstantiality is noted.

No abnormalities in stream of talk elicited. Emotional reactions seem appropriate.

Patient denies any hallucination experiences. He explained that what he referred to when the doctors at other hospitals questioned him about hearing voices, was the "echo" or after effect of previous conversations. Thus after a heated discussion, when he would return to his quarters, he would hear the forever "talk" in his mind. At no time, though has he ever heard "voices", seen "images" or had any similar "imagination."

Patient describes his writing ambitions. He has written several novels, one when he was quite young, another just prior to joining the service, and one he is writing now.

Patient states he believes he might have been nervous when in boot camp because he had been working too hard just prior to induction. He had been writing a novel, in the style of James Joyce, about his own home town, and averaging approximately 16 hours daily in an effort to get it down. This was an experiment and he doesn't intend to publish. At present he is writing a novel about his experiences in the Merchant Marine. Patient is very vague in describing all these activities. There seems to be an artistic factor in his thinking when discussing his theories of writing and philosophy.

In reviewing his activity just prior to enlistment, the following is given: He spent one year at Columbia on a football scholarship and starred. The following fall he started training but after four days quit and went south, getting over as far as Washington when he went broke. paper as a sports editor but again suddenly quit and went to Washington. Here he did odd jobs on construction for 1 month and then joined the Merchant Marine Service staying 3 months. He then came back to Columbia, paying his way for 3 months, but quit because he felt he had gotten all he could from college. He then worked at odd jobs until he was called in by the Navy. He failed in the Naval Air application because of mechanical inaptitude.

Patient believes he quit football for same reason he couldn't get along in Navy, he can't stand regulations, etc.

5-30-43:

Information from outside source confirms most of the data given by the patient. According to this information this patient has had marked conflicts, about his religion. He is trying to resolve, according to his parents, a religious philosophy that will be satisfactory to himself. Also he tends to brood a good deal.

6-2-43: At a staff conference this date the diagnosis Constitutional Psychopathic State, Schizoid Personality was agreed upon. It was agreed that this patient has shown strong schizoid trends which have bordered upon but which have not yet reached the level of psychosis. He is considered

interpreted to be auditory and visual hallucinations, ideas of reference and suicide and a rambling, grandiose, philosophical manner. At the Naval Hospital, this patient appeared to be restless, apathetic, seclusive and described experiences which were interpreted to be auditory and visual hallucinations. The diagnosis Dementia Praecox was established and upon the approved recommendation of a Board of Medical Survey, the patient was transferred to this hospital, arriving here on May 20, 1943.

At this hospital, this patient continued to be restless, apathetic, seclusive, and somewhat grandiose, but denied ever having had hallucinatory experiences, explaining the previously described experiences as "echo" effects in his mind of conversations he had had previously. According to the patient, he had made a very poor adjustment in school and in work. He impulsively left school because he felt he had nothing further to learn; and then left, just as precipitously, various jobs such as sports writer for a local newspaper because he felt too stilted and held back in there. Without any particular training or background, this patient, just prior to his enlistment, enthusiastically embarked upon the writing of novels. He sees nothing unusual in this activity. Physical and neurological examinations are negative and mental examination reveals no gross evidence of psychosis. At a Staff Conference on

June 2, 1943, the diagnosis was changed to Constitutional Psychopathic State, Schizoid Personality, it being unanimously agreed that this patient has shown strongschizoid trends which have bordered upon but have not yet reached the level of psychosis, but which render him unfit for service. His discharge from service is recommended.

He admits auditory hallucinations—"music and a bable of voices"—"They might call me names and accuse me of things and swear while they are at it—they might say "you're intolerant, a bigot, a fascist" He also admits ideas of reference. Kerouac has entertained ideas of suicide often and has gone so far as to buy a drug for that purpose on one occasion.

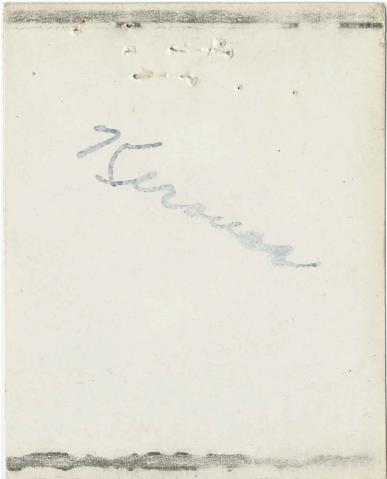

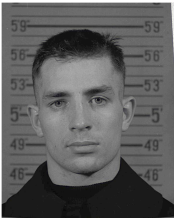

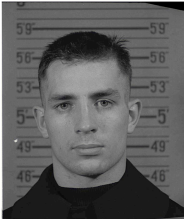
