HISTORY OF THE PRESENT ILLNESS

Name: Jones, James R. Grade: Cpl. Ward: A-4

This 21 yr. Cav. Cpl. under enlisted Nov 10, 1929 at age of 18 yr. 3 yrs x 6 mo overseas duty.

Pt. states he dislocated his rt ankle while playing football during usual scheduled recreational period while in Army on about November, 1940 when a player stepped on his ankle. Occurred at Schofield Barracks recreation area, Hawaii. Had hospitalization. Rt ankle was taped and he was given light duty for a few days. Ankle seemed to feel alright.

During 1941 and up to March, 1943 pt states he sprained his rt ankle about 15 times. States the ankle would dislocate and then come back into position - but each time his ankle became weaker.

In March, 15, 1943 pt was admitted to the 25 Div. Gen Hosp Guadalcanal for Rx of two infections on rt shin and for sprained rt ankle. They waited until infections subsided and then he was evacuated to Naval Base Hosp #3, New Hebrides where pt was operated on, had open-reduct and fixation with silver wire of rt ankle for recurrent dislocation.

Arrived Henderson S. Hosp. letter pt May, 1943 & arrived K.G.H. 6-1-43. States he had Shrapnel wound of left parietal scalp - flesh wound Jan 14?, 1943. Rx at Div. Hosp & then Bryan. Pierce 1st Lt The Surgeon for 1 mi. to New Hebrides Naval Base Guadalcanal.
