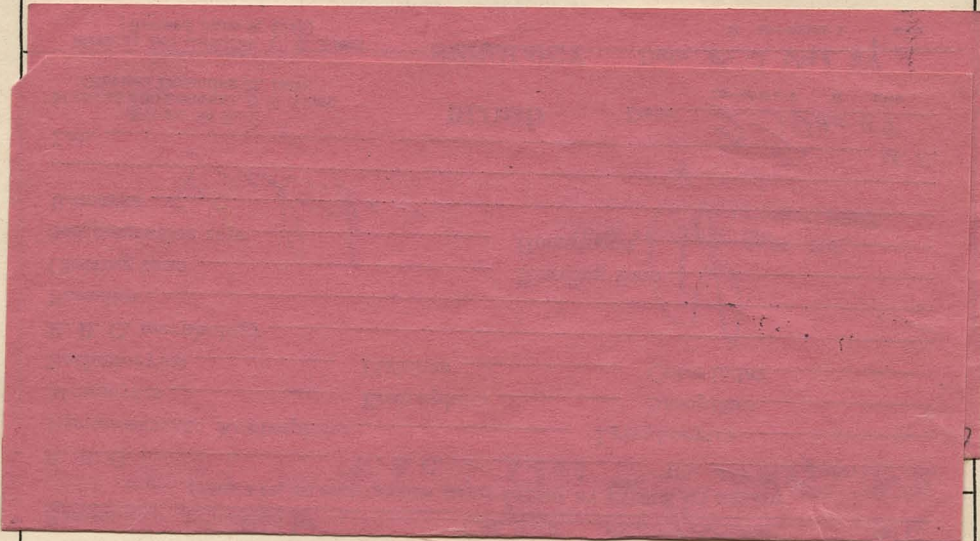

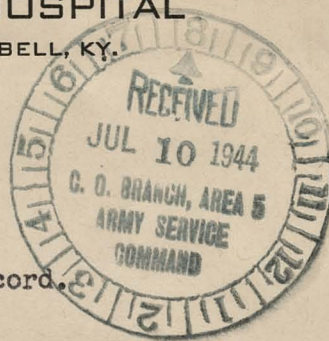

Opinion of consultant: Sprained right ankle 1941 playing football in Hawaii. Was operated for repair ligament in New Hebrides in 1943 March, at Naval hospital(?). Now he alleges he has pain in scar and weakness of ankle on excessive walking.

Exam:- Has very mild Cavus of both feet. There is mild restricted motion in inversion right ankle. There is no swelling noted. A scar is present extending under the lateral malleolus, which he alleges is tender to palpation. Patient probably has symptoms after excessive walking or walking over rough terrain. Ought to be helped with arch supports. He impresses me with some exaggeration of complaints. From Ortho standpoint recommend duty Circ 164.

History of the present illness:

Patient states he dislocated his right ankle while playing football during recreational period while in Army, on or about 10 Nov 40, when a player stepped on his ankle. This occurred in Hawaii. No hospitalization. Right ankle was taped and he was given light duty for a few days. Ankle seemed to feel alright. During 1941, and up to March 1943, patient states he sprained his right ankle about 15 times. States that the ankle would dislocate and then come back into position, but each time his ankle became weaker. On 15 March 43, patient was admitted to the 25th Div. General Hospital, Guadalcanal for two infections on right shin, and for sprained right ankle. They waited until infections subsided, and then he was evacuated to Naval Base Hospital, #3, New Hebrides, where patient was operated on.

Chief complaint:

Recurrent dislocation-right ankle.

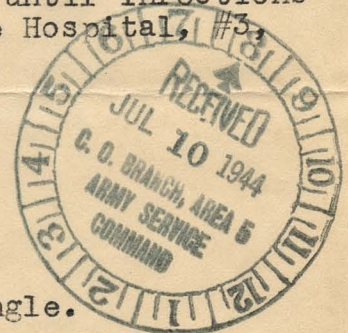

Radiologic record:

4 June 1943; Examination of the bones of the right ankle reveals no evidence of fracture or dislocation. There is no swelling of the soft tissues. There is generalized osteoporosis of the bones of the ankle and foot.

Operation report:

3 June 43; Circular plaster removed, and X-Rays taken. No new circular plaster applied.

Final summary:

Soon after admission here, the cast was removed and physiotherapy instituted. He progressed satisfactorily, and was given a furlough. At the present time, function of the ankle is normal, and he gets around well. As further hospitalization is no longer necessary, he may be discharged to Full Duty.

Final diagnosis:

1. Dislocation, simple, recurrent, right ankle, initial injury received while playing football during his scheduled recreation period at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii.
2. Abscess periapical, acute; R-8, cause-carries.
3. Pulpitis, chronic: R-14; L-15-16, cause-carries.
4. Dental Caries: R-5,13,16; L-1,3,4,8,12.
5. Filling, defective: L-1.
6. Dental Foci suspected.
7. Calculus: heavy.

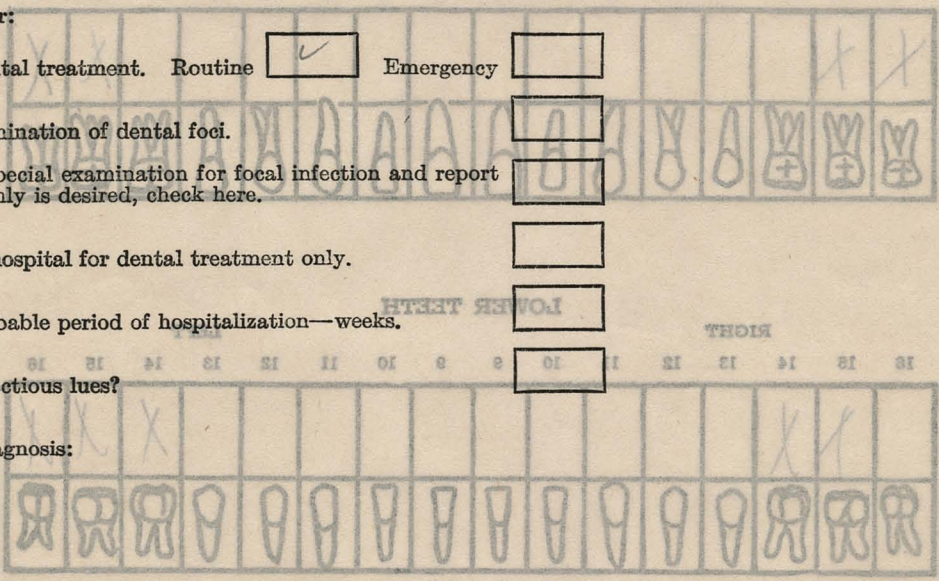
